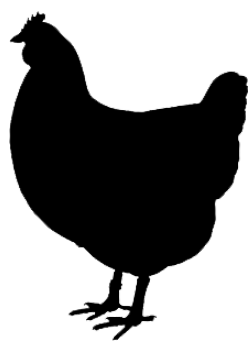


# HOW MANY CHICKENS PER COOP



## HENHOUSE SIZE

### HOW MANY CHICKENS FIT ON THE ROOST BARS?

We prefer the 1-foot rule, which allows for one foot per chicken on the roost bars. One foot per chicken on the roost bar promotes less fighting and ensures you don't overload your henhouse.



## RUN SIZE

### IS YOUR FLOCK FREE RANGED?

The minimum chickens need is 10 sq. ft per chicken. However, chickens do much better if they are given as much room as possible. If chickens are too confined, fighting can occur and their health and well-being can suffer.



## EGG HUTCH

### HOW MANY HENS PER NEST BOX?

Hens tend to use the same one or two nest boxes. Anywhere from 3-8 chickens will lay in the same nest box. (Not usually at the same time) Our egg hutches have removable dividers to accommodate more than one hen.

## DO THE MATH

### SQUARE FOOTAGE OF RUN & TOTAL FEET OF ROOST BAR

If you cannot free range your flock at least some of the time, the run size of most of our coops will probably accommodate less chickens than the henhouse. Please consider both sizes when determining which size coop to get.

$$\text{chicken} + \text{chicken} = 5$$

## CHICKEN MATH IS REAL

### YOU WILL NEVER HAVE ENOUGH

Always give yourself enough room to grow your flock. You may have a broody hen, or want different types or breeds, or want many different colored eggs. You can never have enough room or enough chickens.
